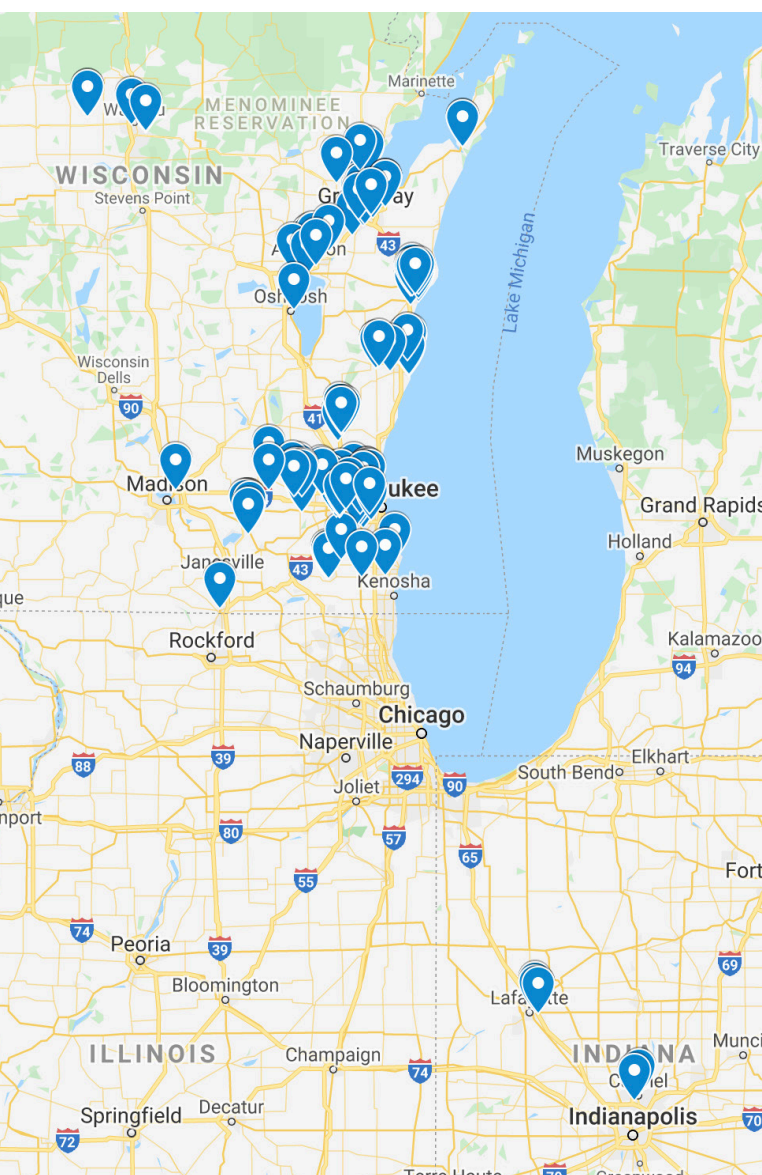

Homes for Independent Living of Wisconsin (HIL) operates more than 100 residential locations supporting about 400 clients in community-based settings.

Prader-Willi Homes (PWH) supports approximately 80 adults with Prader-Willi Syndrome in community settings in and near Oconomowoc, Wisconsin.

Paragon Community Services (PCS) offers programs serving approximately 300 adults, young adults, and children with intellectual & developmental disabilities through Adult Day Services and Paragon Activity Club (PAC) youth respite services.

Genesee Lake School (GLS) provides education, therapeutic and vocational services for approximately 85 students in its residential school and nearly 35 students in its day school in Wisconsin.

The Richardson School (TRS) operates five Day Schools serving over 180 children in Southeastern Wisconsin.

Genesee Community Services (GCS) provides in-home services for more than 150 children and their families in Wisconsin. GCS also provides clinic based ABA services to children under the age of six in Waukesha County.

T.C. Harris School and Academy (TCH) serves approximately 80 students through a residential school and day school in Lafayette, Indiana.

Transitions Academy of Indiana (TAI) serves approximately 70 youth with significant emotional, behavioral and mental health challenges in a secure treatment setting in Indianapolis, Indiana.
